



PL115-123 SUPPLEMENTAL DISASTER RESPONSE

- Public Law 115-123 provides \$17.398 billion to USACE for disaster recovery for: Investigations, Construction, Operation and Maintenance (O&M), Flood Control and Coastal Emergencies, Mississippi River and Tributaries, Expenses
- Initial allocation of ~\$360 million for Operation & Maintenance (O&M) has been released and will address highest priority damages and shoaling as a result of natural disasters
